The **3rd Digital Witness Symposium** explores the dynamics of transnational collaboration and collective storytelling in the digital era. Filmmaker and journalist **JIGAR MEHTA** will discuss his crowd-sourced documentary project about the ongoing Egyptian revolution, **18 Days in Egypt**, and **KEN HARPER** from the Newhouse School will talk about the African media development projects, **Together Liberia** and **New Narratives**.

**JIGAR MEHTA** is a documentary filmmaker and journalist. He is co-creator of the collaborative documentary project, **18 Days in Egypt**, which was developed while Mehta was a John S. Knight Fellow at Stanford University. Before his fellowship at Stanford, Mehta was a video journalist for the *New York Times*.

**KEN HARPER** is an award-winning designer, photojournalist and media educator. He is an Assistant Professor of Multimedia Photography and Design at Syracuse University, as well as the Director of Digital and Visual Media for New Narratives, an association of African journalists for change.
